Application by a proxy to vote by post

Voting by post

Only one person can apply to vote by post using this form. Voting by post is an easy and convenient way of voting if you are unable to get to the polling station.

You can use this form to apply to vote by post for a particular election or referendum, for a set period of time or for all future polls depending on how long the elector has requested their proxy for. Postal votes can be sent to addresses in the UK and abroad. You must be registered and eligible to vote.

How do I apply to vote by post?

- Fill in the postal vote application form, entering the full name of the person who has appointed you as their proxy and the address where they are registered to vote.
- Make sure you complete all sections of the form and supply your date of birth and signature. Your date of birth
 and signature are needed on this application form, and again when you use your postal vote. This information
 is needed to prevent fraud. If you are unable to sign this form, please contact your local electoral registration
 office. You can find address details at the back of this form.
- Return your form to your local electoral registration office. Address details can be found at the back of this
 form.

The deadline for returning your postal vote application may vary depending on which county you live in. Please visit **electoralcommission.org.uk/postalvote** for more information about deadlines.

If you are not already registered to vote, you must register before applying for a postal vote. The deadline to register to vote is **midnight**, **12 working days before the poll**. Register to vote online at **www.gov.uk/register-to-vote**

What happens after I've returned this form?

- When an election or referendum is going to be held, your ballot paper will be sent to you in the post. To find out when your ballot paper will be issued you can contact your elections team at your council.
- Make sure you return your postal vote so that it arrives by the close of poll, otherwise it will not be counted. A
 freepost envelope is included in your postal ballot pack. But, if you are sending it from overseas, you will need
 to pay the postage.
- If it is too late to send your vote back by post, you can hand it in on polling day to the elections office at your council, or drop it off at certain polling stations.

Privacy Statement

We collect information under the legal basis of a task carried out in the public interest, as set out in the Representation of the People Act 1983 and related regulations. We will look after personal information securely and follow data protection legislation.

If you opted-out of the open register we will only use the information you give us for electoral purposes, including matching it against other sources of data to support the electoral register. We will not give personal information to anyone else, unless we have to by law. The law requires us to share your information with candidates, political parties and campaigners for democratic engagement purposes and credit reference agencies to check your identity when you apply for credit.

If you have <u>not</u> opted-out of the open register your name and address can be bought by anyone and used for lots of purposes, including direct marketing.
