You can apply to vote by post for a particular election, for a set period of time or until further notice. You will need to use a different form to apply for a postal vote in UK Parliament elections.

#### How do I apply to vote by post?

- Fill in the postal vote application form.
- Make sure you complete all required sections of the form and provide your date of birth and signature.
   This information is needed to prevent fraud. If you are unable to sign this form, please contact your local electoral registration office. Contact details can be found at the end of this form.
- Return your form to your local electoral registration office. You can find address details at the end of this form.

The deadline for returning your postal vote application is **5pm**, **11 working days before the poll**.

If you are not registered to vote, you must apply to register before applying for a postal vote. The deadline to register to vote is midnight, 12 working days before the poll. Register to vote online at gov.uk/register-to-vote

#### What happens after I have returned this form?

- Your local electoral registration office will confirm if your application has been accepted or rejected.
- When an election is going to be held, your ballot paper will be sent to you in the post. For more information on the delivery of the postal ballot pack, you can contact your local elections office.
- Your postal ballot pack will contain instructions for voting by post and returning your postal vote.
- Make sure you return your postal vote so that it arrives by the deadline, otherwise it will not be counted.
